Elected Official/Department Head Updates:

<u>County Commissioner Linda Jarvis</u>: Ms. Jarvis said she will be retiring at the end of her term. She presented the board with a spreadsheet as to where the county will be spending the ARPA funds they received.

<u>Fire Department Report</u>: Fire Chief Mark Hagemeister presented the Fire Report for February. There were 23 Medical First Responder calls and 5 Fire calls for the month.

There is an Auxiliary breakfast scheduled for April 3rd. The Easter Bunny will be present for pictures.

The Fire Department is back to 100% in person training.

Bids for the new Fire Truck must be in by 4pm on April 4th.

The Auxiliary is hosting a Dueling Pianos fundraiser on April 9th, tickets are still available.

Police Department Report: The police report for the month of February reported the following,

- Officers responded to a total of 223 calls for service for the month of February.
- Officers conducted a total of 35 traffic stops. Of those traffic stops, 8 citations were issued for traffic violations, 15 traffic crash reports were handled by officers. Of those crashes, 8 were property damage and 6 included deer. There was 1 personal injury accident and there were 3 arrests for operating while intoxicated.
- The Department is struggling to fill the 3 open part-time positions.
- Officers are continuing to have a daily presence at both the Dryden Elementary School and the Dryden High School.
- The Department is still encouraging residents to utilize their house check service for those that are out of town.

<u>Planning Commission Report:</u> Motion made by English, seconded by Hazen to accept the Planning Commission Annual Report for 2021. Motion Carried.

<u>Cemetery Clean-up:</u> Motion made by Lowney, seconded by Diefenbach to accept the bid from MML Landscaping for the spring clean-up of the cemeteries. Motion carried.

<u>Cemetery Maintenance:</u> Motion made by Diefenbach, seconded by English to pay \$650 to Troop 130 for the care of North Mill Cemetery and \$700 for the Dryden Center Cemetery. Motion carried.

<u>Lapeer County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update</u>: Motion made by Diefenbach, seconded by Lowney to adopt the Lapeer County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. Motion carried.

<u>Road work:</u> Motion made by English, seconded by Diefenbach to accept the Road Project Agreements with the Lapeer County Board of Road Commissioners for a total of \$77,633.60. Motion carried.

<u>Fire Department Station 2 Heater:</u> Motion made by Hazen, seconded by Diefenbach to contract with Hill Heating and Cooling to replace the heating system for \$4895.00. Motion carried.

<u>Fire Department Flood</u>: Motion made by Lowney, seconded by English to contract with ARC Building Solutions for \$1,514.50 to strip and refinish the flooring in areas of Station 1 and contract with The Duct Doctor for \$1,500.00 for cleaning and disinfect/deodorizing of the duct work at Station 1. Motion carried.
